REFERENCE: Cooperation between PGU-DS and PGU-KGB Directorates for Scientific and Technical Intelligence for the period 15 February 1979 – 15 February 1980

In the reviewed period the development of the fraternal cooperation with PGU-KGB Scientific and Technical Intelligence Directorate continued on the base of annually working meetings of various levels. Besides the intelligence information exchange some concrete operational issues over the objects of penetration and the agents work has been discussed at the meetings.

We received from the Soviet comrades new information for the “MBB”*, NATO central construction trust, etc. We received as well instructions and tasks for our work with the objects “IZOV”, “RACHMANN”, “GOESLER”, “GUSTAVO”, “TAYLOR”, “SEM”, and others. We have exchanged operational information for more than twenty persons, and permanently reviewed the tasks for obtaining new information at the military area, electronics, chemistry, etc.

In April 1980 there was hold in Sofia our last meeting with PGU-KGB Scientific and Technical Directorate’ leadership, while in October our working group visited

Moscow for exchange on electronic information system establishment. Our delegation had talks in Moscow with the leadership of PGU-KGB Scientific and Technical Directorate, and received valuable instructions for the intelligence work of our residents in Tokyo and Canada.

Extremely useful was the presence in Sofia of the representative of PGU-KGB Scientific and Technical Directorate, Comrade V. A. Zaytsev, who was a live connection between our two directorates in our everyday work.

During the reviewed period we received from the Soviet comrades 565 pieces of scientific, technical and economic intelligence information, 41 of which are extremely valuable for our economy. Among them are the complete documentation for production of bubble memory, and materials about IBM-370 system. 68 documents are assessed by the customers as valuable.

We have sent to the Soviet comrades 2351 pieces of intelligence information (1724 of which on microfiches). As “extremely valuable” are assessed the documents about DEC system.
